Before Henry can react, he gets a call from his brother Thomas who informs him that their grandmother is dying.

Henry travels to his family's horse wrangling ranch in a rural area. He meets up with Thomas, with whom he has a strained relationship. Maxima, their frail grandmother, is afflicted with dementia and making disparaging remarks about her late husband Joseph.

Henry flashes back to when he was 10 years old and forgot to lock the horse pen gate, allowing for a stampede that trampled his grandfather to death. Or at least this is what he believes it happened... Then, he is in a room with children lining up in a row. A man wearing a mask with a Pied Piper tattoo sits opposite him, wearing only underwear.

Henry's flashback is interrupted by Thomas who asks him for help fixing a fence. As they work, Thomas' horse gets spooked, throws him, knocking him out with a blow to the head. Henry is forced to get over his fear of horses and rides to get help.

While Thomas is in the hospital, Henry finds in the barn boxes with photos of himself and Thomas at a young age similarly posed to the children in the row. He realizes that his grandfather was a pedophile and child trafficker. Maxima, unaware that her grandson is in the barn, pours petrol everywhere. A fire is set and Henry struggles to escape. She's loathed Joseph after finding out that he molested his daughter and grandkids. The truth is that when her husband got trampled by the horses, she smothered him to death.

Back in the present, Maxima dies. Henry returns to Sydney and begins investigating leads that his brother uncovered. Lisa and Henry join forces, find the IP address location of The Piper's network but the computer that originated it is wiped out. Henry interrogates numerous pedophiles and finally manages to get Peter to confess that he kidnapped kids for The Piper. He points Henry to the Red Gallery, a dark web site used to sell children. While Peter is out of the room, Henry sets up a spy cam in his apartment. Once he leaves, The Piper and his cahoots brutally murder Peter for talking.

Henry and Lisa access the Red Gallery and discover that missing children will be auctioned in a few hours. Henry finds the location of the Red Gallery where children are bid on like a piece of property. Henry lights a fire in the control room as a distraction and frees the children from their cells while getting the upper hand against their captors.

Upon reviewing the hidden spy cam footage from Peter's place, Henry learns that John, his chief inspector, is the Pied Piper! He was the masked man who molested him and his brother. John is put in cuffs, but not before revealing that he was his own father! Eventually, Henry overcomes his past, closes his emotional wounds and reopens Maxima's ranch, this time to heal children and horses.










Raul The Terrible
